**RESPONDING TO THE FINDINGS OF THE ROYAL COMMISSION**

This conference is intended to help all Christians to grasp and reflect on the implications of the findings of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

The Royal Commission has been a momentous and resonant event whose implications will take time to be fully understood by everyone. It has been pointed out, too, that, while some larger churches with a long history in Australia may have special administrative units for addressing such issues, other churches may still be working out what they need to do next in a systematic way.

We hope that this day's presentations and discussions will lead to greater understanding and discernment for all of us as we share questions and experiences in an ecumenical setting. The conference is for everyone, especially lay leaders and members of the congregations, but also clergy seeking further guidance for the journey ahead and greater awareness of the concerns of their congregations indeed, this is for anyone interested.

The keynote speaker, who will be with us through the day, is a long-time leader of the Anglican program for addressing sexual abuse in the church and was a Chair of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse Working Group.
